

1. Adaptive Technologies

The provision of devices, aids, controls, appliances or supplies of either communication or adaptive type determined necessary to enable the person to increase his or her ability to function with independence and safety skills in a home and community-based setting.

1. Advocacy

Advocacy services help persons with developmental disabilities and their families obtain the rights and privileges to which they are entitiled.

2. After Day/After School Program (Respite)

These respite programs serve school age children for two to three hours a day, from one to five days per week, and offer social recreational, educational and enrichment activities.

4. Counseling/Personal Skill Building/Parent Training
Skills training for individuals with disabilities. Training and/or
counseling for parents who are DD. Training and /or counseling
for parents or siblings of individuals with developmental disabilities.

6. Crisis Intervention/Behavior Modification

Emergency short term assistance to families experiencing life stresses and problems while supporting a person with a developmental disability at home. Professional staff, behavior modification.

7. Day Camp/Summer Day Camp (Respite)

Social, recreational educational and enrichment activities.

8. Environmental Modifications

Selected internal and external changes to the person's physical home environment, which are necessary to ensure the health, welfare and safety of the person and to enable him or her to function with greater independence in the home.

9. Family Reimbursement.

These programs provide subsidy to families to pay for specific goods and services that are not funded by any other program.

11. Financial Counseling

Financial assistance programs help families obtain financial benefits and entitlements.

12. Guardianship

Assistance with obtaining guardianship for a family member with a developmental disability.

12. In-Home Respite

This program provides relief in the home to families who care for family members with developmental disabilities as scheduled.

Short term case management is provided for those not Medicaid eligible or having extenuating circumstances.

19. Out of Home Respite

Respite services provided in the community in a variety of ways.

19. Outreach

Outreach services to educate the community about existing and connecting them to services.

19. Overnight Respite

Respite provided overnight in a variety of settings.

21. Recreation/Socialization

Social, recreations, trips, educational and enrichment activities.

24. School Holiday/Program Holiday Respite

Respite services provided in or out of the home during legal holidays.

25. Weekend Respite

Weekend respite provided in a variety of settings in home, hotels, and community to relieve caretakers.

27. Front Door/OPWDD Coordinators of Services

The Front Door process will guide you through the steps involved in finding out if you are eligible for services with OPWDD. Connecting you to (CCO/PHP), a case management agency, and approving final initial services and waiver enrollment.

28. Supplemental Information

Community resources which may assist families and agencies throughout NY and provide alternative services.

INTRODUCTION

This is a comprehensive listing of all programs in Queens that are funded by the New York State Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) through Family Support Services contracts and administered by the local Bernard Fineson Developmental Disabilities Regional Office, Region 4 (BFDDRO).

Also included are Family Support programs funded by New York City Department of Health, Mental Hygiene. There are also many other governmental and community based services in this guide.

These programs serve developmentally disabled individuals and their families. To utilize these programs, the individual must reside with his or her family in Queens county and be eligible for services (exception: Non-Medicaid Evaluations). Most services must receive prior approval via OPWDD's Front Door or CCO Alert box (Service Amendment). Developmental Disabilities include Intellectually Challenged, Neurological Impairment, Epilepsy, Cerebral Palsy, Down's Syndrome, Traumatic Brain Injuries and Autism, among others.

Family Support programs are designed to strengthen the delivery of support services to families caring for disabled family members at home as well as to maintain and stabilize the family unit, and disabily to reduce the potential for out-of-home placement. We encourage Care Coordinators to familiarize themselves with the services in this guide and to assist families in supporting those they care for at home.

Respite and Family Support Services

FREE STANDING/OVER NIGHT RESPITES -OPWDD encourages all Care Coordinators and families to set up regular respite, overnight respites and other supports for individuals to ensure they are adequately supported. Routine respite and supports to families have been found to substantially reduce crisis/emergency situations and to relief families.

Prior to an Over Night (FSR) Respite Program, all the respite providers must receive the documents listed below from the families Care Coordinators. All evaluations, permissions, and physician order forms must be current (within the present year). All documents requested, are important to expedite the application processes. Please do not send any application without the required paperwork that the respite provider requests below.

Current Medical
2 Consecutive PPD readings (once submitted we will not request additional PPD)
Current Medication/Feeding order (as well as over the counter medications)/Evacuation Assessments may also be needed.
Most recent Psychological and Psychosocial

Current ISP Addendum
LOC eligibility determination form (yearly)
Waiver documents including NOD /Addendum
Copy of Medicaid or insurance card.
Approved Service Amendment from OPWDD (completed by CCO)

REGULAR RESPITE: Always check with the agency as there may be updates and additional services that are not noted in this guide.

The following are types of respite: In-home, Site Based, Recreation, and Camp. Agencies can also apply for intensive respite in any of these areas.

Family Support Services & Self Direction: Family Supports services must be calculated within a person's Self-Direction budget. They are not to be added outside of an approved full self-directed budget. We ask Care Coordinators, FSS providers and families to be aware of this matter.

Reimbursement- Reimbursements to families should be within reason and should consider the total number of approved requests families already have been allotted.

Family Support Services All FSS services must be reviewed and approved through the DDRO Family Support Coordinator prior to agencies providing the services to families. Excessive requests of a service (Example reimbursement, crisis intervention etc.) may be denied.
